The collection features: the largest Czechoslovakian collection outside Europe, microcars, amphibious vehicles, competition cars, alternative fuel vehicles, prototype and one-of-a-kind vehicles, military vehicles, and motorcycles.

Civil War Tour

The Battle of Franklin were some of the bloodiest hours of the Civil War. 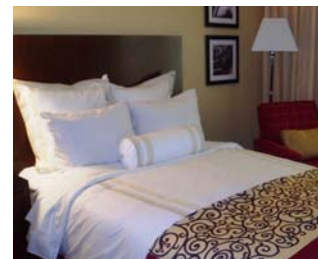

Sam Posey

Sam Posey has been one of the best-known figures in American motorsports for more than 30 years. The internationally-known and versatile racing driver, author, and commentator competed successfully in a wide spectrum of racing categories across a driving career that stretched from the mid 1960s through 1981.

After he retired from behind the wheel, Posey was quickly sought after as a racing commentator, becoming a regular member of the Indy 500 commentary team for ABC beginning in 1980, when he reported from the pits and the garages. In 1982, he moved into the booth alongside some of the best known commentators in sports, along with other renowned drivers, and remained there through 1996. Later, he joined the Formula One commentary team for Speedvision, continuing through the 2001 season.

The multi-talented Posey holds a degree from the Rhode Island School of Design in Providence and continues his lifelong work as a painter. He also is an architect, having worked with his brother to design the Michelin Tower, a multi-use building at the start of Lime Rock race track. He has been an avid railroader all his life and recently completed a book, *Playing with Trains: A Passion Beyond Scale*, which was released by publisher Random House in November of 2005.
